June 16, Friday Cliff House to Brunswick, Maine

Air Note: Everyone is responsible for their own flight arrangements. You will be flying home from Bangor (BGR), June 20.

• Leaving the Cliff House this morning, our coach takes us to Portland (1-hour).

- Upon arriving get your sea legs on and join the crew of the <u>Lucky Catch</u> to learn about lobstering from the pros. We will spend 1&½ hours in the Gulf of Maine learning about this unique business. For those who want fresh lobster for lunch, we leave the ship with our catch, walk around the dock to the Portland Lobster Company Restaurant where our crustaceans will be boiled and served.
- Following lunch, we'll stop in nearby <u>Freeport</u>, famous as a center for <u>outlet stores</u> <u>LL</u> Bean, Patagonia, North Face, Ralph Lauren, Levi's and many other famous brands. A Ben & Jerry's ice cream store is also there.
- Late afternoon arrival and check-in he Federal Hotel Brunswick, ME

- This morning we head through scenic coastal areas to <u>Boothbay Harbor</u> to visit <u>the Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens</u>. The mission of Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens is to "protect, preserve, and enhance the botanical heritage and natural landscapes of coastal Maine for people of all ages through horticulture, education and research." Today's Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens comprises 270 acres of tidal shore land.
- Thereafter, we have open time for lunch and exploring in Boothbay Harbor. A yachting resort town tucked around a picturesque harbor, Boothbay retains the look of an old-fashioned seaport. Boats and water-front nature abound; tourism flourishes all around the inlet. There are good shopping opportunities and scenic vistas to enjoy.
- Mid-afternoon return to The Federal. Dinner is open in Brunswick tonight.

June 18 Sunday Brunswick to Bar Harbor

- Our morning route northward to <u>Bar Harbor</u> is mainly along US-1 and Maine's rugged coastline. Bar Harbor sits on Mount Desert Island. The town's sprawling mansions, delightful cottages, eclectic shops, and international cuisine (including the justly famous lobster) and nearby lighthouses add to its appeal.
- Arrival, check-in and lunch at the <u>Bar Harbor Inn</u>, situated on Frenchman Bay and within easy walking distance to stores & restaurants. This afternoon, we'll enjoy a guided walking tour of the town. Dinner is on our own tonight.

The Inn's Reading Room has been serving New England favorites for a century.

June 19, Monday Bar Harbor

- After a short walk to the dock, we embark on a 2&1/2 hour cruise into Frenchman's Bay and the Gulf of Maine to see the most sought-after iconic symbols of Maine, Puffins and Lighthouses. If our luck holds, we will see ospreys, harbor porpoise, eagles and other wildlife.
- Alternatively, you can join a tour of <u>Acadia National Park</u> famous for it's coves, pristine forests, beaches, plunging cliffs, rocky islands and the stunning views.
- Upon returning to the Inn, the afternoon is open to further explore and enjoy Bar Harbor.
- **6:30pm** Gather at the Inn's Porcupine room for dinner overlooking the harbor. .

Weather— The average high in Portland is 74°F, low 54; Bar Harbor 71°F and 50. June averages 3.9" of rain; bring a rain jacket or umbrella just in case.



CONDITIONS

Reservations and Payment: Reservations will be confirmed by American Travel Association (ATA) upon receipt of the Reservation Coupon and \$250 per person deposit. Receipt of final payment is due in the office of ATA no later than April 14, 2023. All payments must be made by check, MasterCard, Visa, Discover or American Express cards.

Cancellation: Cancellations must be made in writing to ATA. To avoid discrepancies, ATA will not act on information given over the phone until written notice has been received.

<u>Land Package</u>: A \$150 per person cancellation fee will be charged regardless of the reason. Penalty on cancellations received between April 15 and departure will be a maximum of 100% of the land cost per person, depending upon the amount recoverable from the suppliers to whom payment had been sent. Cancellation penalties are required to offset non-refundable hotel and supplier payments made by ATA in advance of the tour. There will be no refund for unused services once the tour has begun.

Insurance: Trip cancellation, baggage and medical insurance coverage is strongly recommended. When last minute illnesses occur to you or family members, the insurance helps offset non-refundable charges. ATA suggests Allianz Travel Insurance_https://www.allianztravelinsurance.com/_or 800-284-8300.

• ATA's Allianz ACCAM ID is F O27608. Including this ID in your insurance purchase enables ATA to help should you need to cancel & file a claim.
