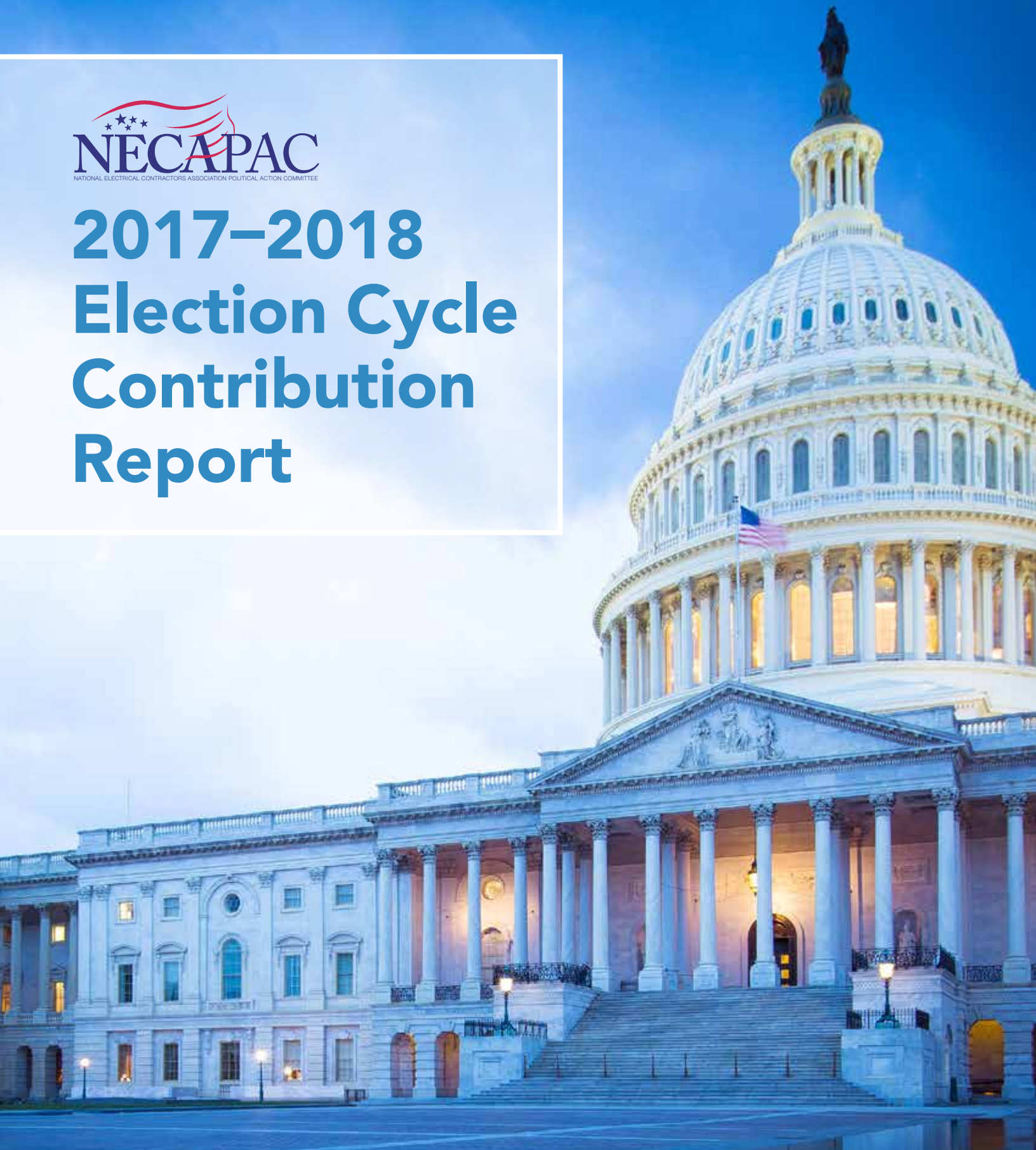




2017–2018 Election Cycle Contribution Report



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NECA’s political action program collects individual personal contributions from NECA members and distributes those funds to worthwhile candidates for the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives. This work is carried out through the National Electrical Contractors Association Political Action Committee (NECAPAC), chartered as a “separate segregated” fund under NECA’s direction.

A Letter from 2017–2018 PLC Chairman Mark Mazur



It was a pleasure to serve as your PLC National Chairman for the 2017-2018 election cycle. We achieved a great deal in just two years and I am happy to report that this election cycle was record-breaking in every way.

2018 was the first time that NECAPAC collected more than \$1 Million in a single year, raising nearly \$160,000 more than the previous record in 2015.

We also increased membership in the Political Leadership Council by 26 members, giving us 111 maximum donors for the year. Six additional NECA Chapters met their NECAPAC goals in 2018, increasing the number of PLC Chapters to 51.

One of my goals as PLC Chairman was to get the younger generation of NECA members involved in NECAPAC and government affairs. To achieve this, in 2017, we launched a new program called the NextGen PLC, which created a pathway for those new to NECAPAC to join the Political Leadership Council at a lower rate of \$2,500 for two years, and then become a full PLC member on their third year of membership. This was done in conjunction with the NextGen Fly-In, which was a meeting much like the

National Legislative Conference, but with a focus on first-timers in Washington, DC and those NECA members that were new to NECA's government affairs efforts and NECAPAC. The first two years of this program brought great success, with over 50 first-time attendees to the NextGen Fly-In and seven members joining the NextGen PLC.

This tremendous success can only be attributed to the devoted NECA members who have dedicated their time and money to advancing NECA's legislative efforts and expanding NECA's brand on Capitol Hill. It is a privilege to be fighting for our industry alongside all of you.

Thank you for the honor of serving as the PLC Chairman for the 2018 election cycle. I am looking forward to NECAPAC's continued growth and success under the leadership of Ted Brady of Progressive Electric, the 2019 PLC Chairman.

A Letter from Government Affairs Executive Director Marco Giamberardino



The past two years and the 2018 election cycle proved to be truly historic for NECA and our members. For the first time since 2009, NECA had the opportunity to work with a new administration. We, along with every other association in Washington, DC, spent a great amount of time maneuvering to put our agenda in front of the White House and the 115th Congress. I am pleased to report that NECA worked to ensure your voice was heard whether it was on Capitol Hill or in the White House.

In the face of some uncertainty entering into 2017, NECA maintained a steady course and worked to provide our expertise on the important issues affecting the electrical contracting industry. The end result produced several major legislative and regulatory victories that will have a lasting positive impact on our members, including:

- Passage of the first comprehensive tax reform package in 30 years;
- Enactment of the first significant legislation amending the change order process;
- Passage of a five-year bill funding airport construction;
- Legislation investing in our water and waterways infrastructure;
- Delayed in the implementation of the 40 percent Cadillac Tax through 2022;
- Successfully drafted, introduced and cultivated support the 529 *Opening Paths To Invest In Our Nation's Students (OPTIONS) Act*;
- Effectively promoted and nurtured bipartisan of multiemployer pension reform, and;
- Defeated numerous efforts to repeal or curtail the enforcement of the Davis-Bacon Act and the use of Project Labor Agreements.

NECA worked with the Trump Administration, the Congress, and other government agencies to reform or repeal burdensome regulations, such as the Waters of the United States rule, the electronic logging devices rule, paid sick leave, and policies that allowed construction on key pipelines to commence.

I am also especially pleased to report that the NECA Government Affairs Committee advanced the association's new standing policy on Diversity and Inclusion. This new policy will allow NECA to find new ways to welcome individuals who have not had many opportunities to participate in our industry.

Lastly, as you will see from the detail provided in this report, NECAPAC had a record-breaking election cycle by every measurable standard. There were more contributors, more dollars raised, more PLC members, and more NECA chapters that met their goal than any year before. Thanks to your dedication to our efforts, we raised \$1,948,293 from 3,244 contributors. Most notable about 2018 was also the first time NECAPAC collected more than one million dollars in a single year. Thank you!

The winds of change in Washington, DC continue to blow and present new opportunities for NECA. Our advocacy efforts and presence before all levels of government will continue to grow in 2019 and beyond, ensuring that you will have a strong voice on the issues that matter most to you. I hope you take the time to review this report and get a sense of the impact our organization has made in Washington, DC. Thank you for all your support as we continue to work to build an even better, more electrical construction-friendly Congress.

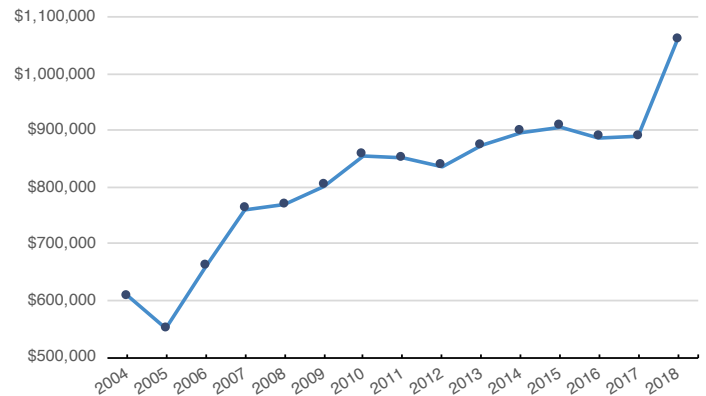

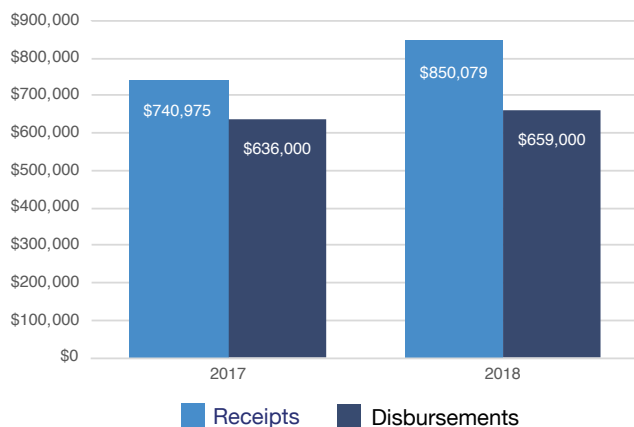

Invest in Our Nation's Infrastructure

A robust investment in our nation's infrastructure is essential to keeping NECA's electrical contractors in business, their employees working, rebuilding our nation, and ensuring a sound economy.

- Find a Sustainable Solution to Fix the Highway Trust Fund
- Expand Investment in Federal Facilities
- Modernize our Airports and Air Traffic Infrastructure
- Fully Fund the Clean Water, and Safe Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund Programs
- Support Long-Term Investment in Waterways Infrastructure
- Build and Upgrade Transmission Line Infrastructure
- Upgrade and Modernize Pipeline Infrastructure

Modernize Our Nation's Energy Policy

The electrical contracting industry specifies, installs and services products related to energy production and efficiency. Deployment of energy efficiency technology and infrastructure has been slow due to marketplace, government and economic barriers. NECA supports a comprehensive energy policy that increases all avenues of domestic production including domestic oil and natural gas exploration as well as clean and renewable energy sources.

Through the Taft-Hartley multiemployer plan system, NECA members provide excellent health care benefits to the hundreds of thousands that they employ. NECA contractors do so knowing that providing top-of-the-line healthcare is both a sound investment in their workforce and good for business. As work continues on Capitol Hill to reform this nation's complex healthcare system, we urge Congress to work towards reduced health care costs, increased access, and improved quality care.

- Prevent the Misclassification of Employees as Independent Contractors
- Oppose Efforts to Repeal, Suspend, or Modify the Davis-Bacon Act

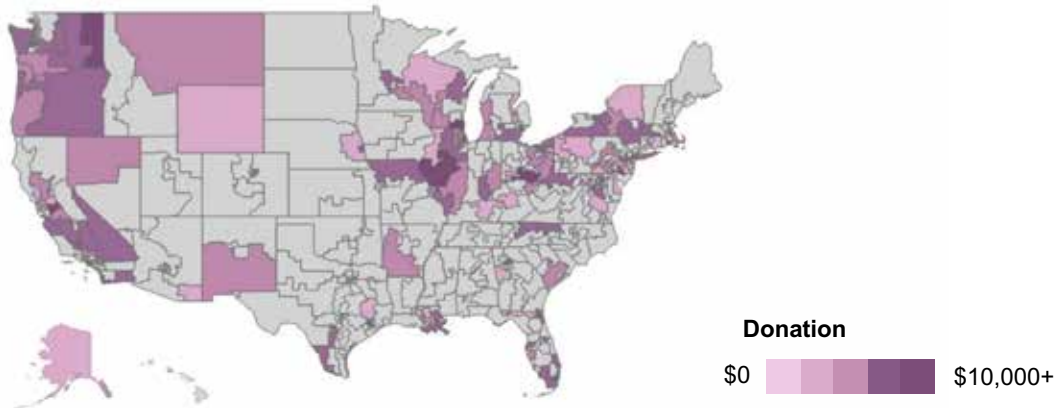

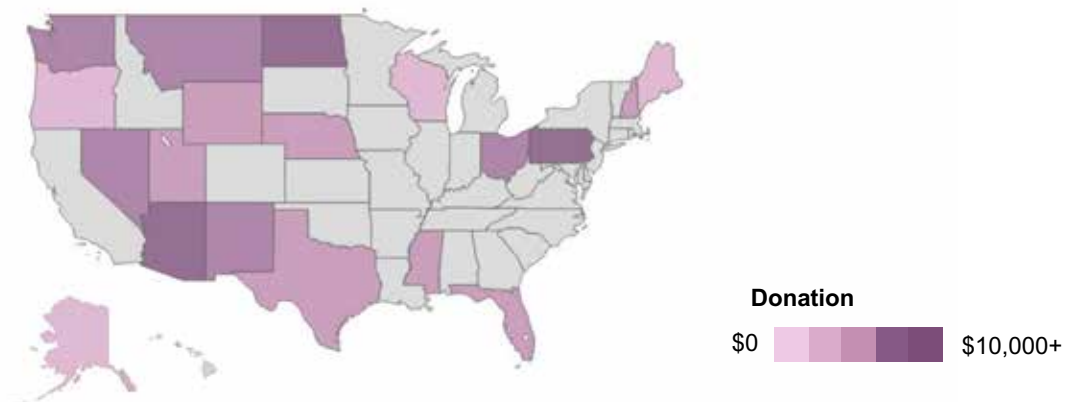

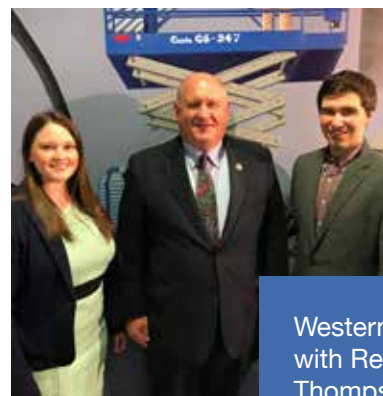
